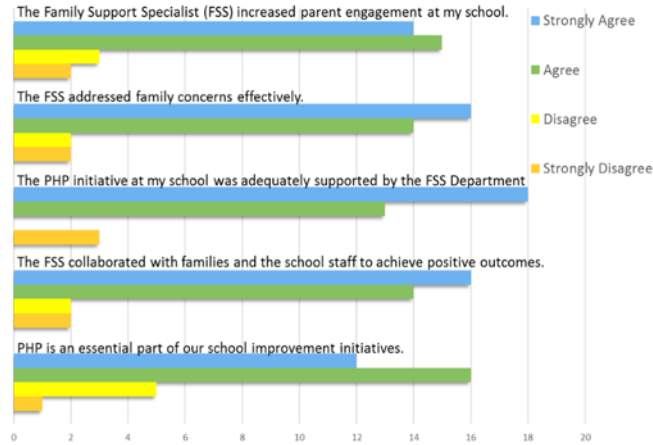

PHP Case Management Data

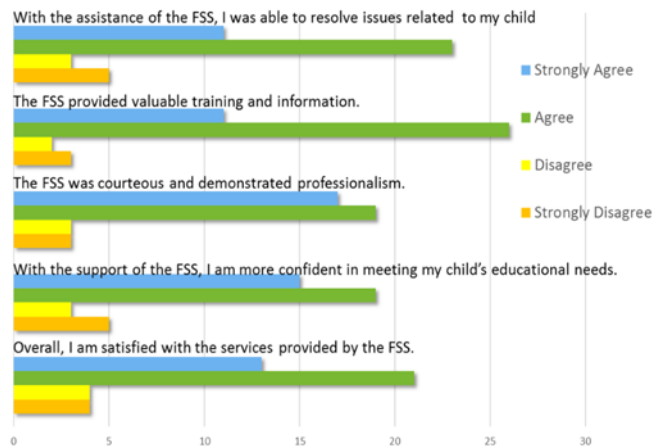

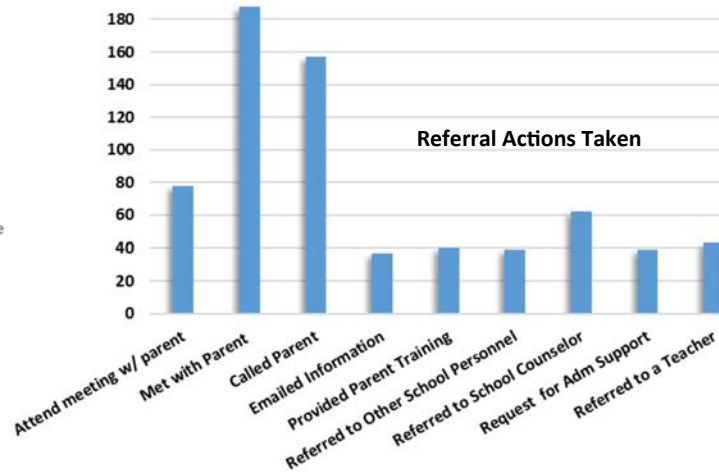
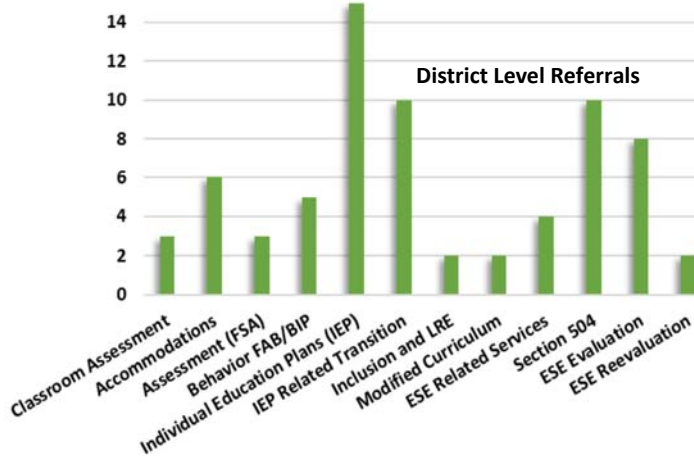
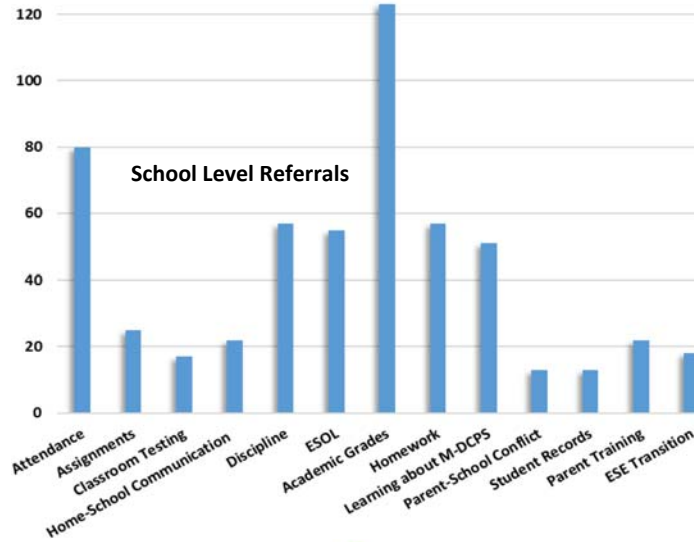
Principal Survey Results June 2017
